Section II: RULES & EXPECTATIONS

II.I BAND DIRECTOR'S "CODE OF CONDUCT"

BAND MEMBERS WILL

- Attend all performances and rehearsals
- Be on time
- Not chew gum during rehearsals and performances
- Have proper music, equipment and/or instrument at the appropriate rehearsal and performance
- Not wear ANY piercings which include earrings, nose rings, lip or eyebrow rings <u>during performances</u>. (if you are planning to get your ears pierced, do it well before a performance so the earrings can be removed)
- Cooperate with ALL band staff, other instructors, chaperones, and student leaders
- Wear the WAHS Band T-shirt under his or her uniform
- Wear appropriate length white socks
- Not have/use electronic devices (i.e. cell phones) during practices, field rehearsals, or performances with the exception of during the 3rd quarter break at football games.
- Adhere and follow all board approved Action & Safety Plans/guidelines for the upcoming season
- Maintain social distancing and wear a protective face mask/covering during all band events if required by the school district administration.

II.II DISCIPLINE POLICY

*Demerits will apply to – but are not limited to – the following infractions.

ATTENDANCE:

- A1. failing to be on time 1
- A2. failing to give prior notification to the instructor for an absence 1
- A3. unexcused absence from a mandatory practice (*work is not an excused absence) 3
- A4. unexcused absence from a game, performance, or event 3

PERFORMANCE OFFENSES:

PE1. failing to be cooperative with other members of the squad 1

- PE2. Leaving the stands at a game without permission. 1
- PE2. Late return from 3rd quarter break. 1

PE3. Using a cell phone during a game or practice without the advisor or director's permission. 1

UNIFORM OFFENSES:

- U1. failing to wear/have all of the assigned uniform parts prior to inspection 1
- U2. losing or leaving clothing during practices or events 1
- U3. Reporting to inspection with dirty uniform or shoes 1
- U4. Participating in practice or performances with incorrect footwear 1

*Uniforms must be brought to school on the following school day if a student leaves early from a performance.

CONDUCT:

- C1. ungracious acceptance of a demerit 1
- C2. unacceptable conduct (i.e. public displays of affection while in uniform) or dangerous conduct 1-2
- C3. unsportsmanlike conduct 3
- C4. omission of reporting a misdemeanor or felony disciplinary action by local authority to your coaches 5
- C5. any violation of the Student Handbook 2
- C6. showing disrespect/disobedience to the band staff or parent chaperones 3
- C7. Vaping or use of any illegal substance during a practice or event 5 & district action
- C8. Vandalism of any kind 5

Enforcement of Demerit System

- 1 demerit = unexcused absence/tardy/minor infractions
- 3 demerits = per unexcused absence from a performance/event.
- 5 accumulated demerits within each period = benching of 1 performance
- Benching for additional performances/practices/events will occur on the 7th demerit & 9th demerit.
- 10 accumulated demerits per season = possible removal from the band or suspension from all remaining season performances

Additional Information:

- Any student on academic probation is benched, as per school rules, but still must attend practices and come to the game dressed in their uniform.
- If you receive an unexcused tardy or if you are marked with an unexcused absence from school, you may not be permitted to practice or perform at a game/event at the administration's discretion.
- Students who leave early must be at school for at least a half day to be permitted to participate in after school activities

II.III

ABSENCE/PARTICIPATION POLICY

- All excuses must be presented to Mr. Nickel PRIOR to the event for approval. (You or your parent should contact Mr. Nickel, not your section leader or friend.)
- Last Minute emergencies which would cause an absence from practice or a performance may emailed to Mr. Nickel: nickel@WASD.school or called into the band room phone: 724-656-8866, ext 1059
- If for some reason a band member is sent home from band camp or another band activity for misconduct, it may lead to permanent removal from the band.
- WORK IS NOT AN ACCEPTABLE EXCUSE FROM A PERFORMANCE OR MANDATORY PRACTICE.
- SPORTING EVENTS/PRACTICES THAT MAY CAUSE AN ABSENCE MUST BE FIRST APPROVED BY MR. NICKEL AND MAY NOT ALWAYS COUNT AS EXECUSED.
 - In an effort to be flexible with sporting event conflicts and pre-planned family events the director and band staff may allow up to two missed performances per season (excluding the band festival) for instrumentalists to count as excused as long as prior approval has been sought with the director. Any additional missed practices or performances for family events or sporting events will count as unexcused and result in up to 3 demerits per missed practice/performance. Flexibility to this policy may be given at the director's discretion.

- Each 9 weeks' grade will depend on music preparation, cooperation, and attendance at performances and rehearsals.
- In order to participate in the Wilmington Area Greyhound Marching Band and Concert Band, ALL band members must be registered through the guidance department and take band as an academic class throughout the entire academic school year.
 - 1. Excused absences from the band events and/or practices include:

Illness Death of family member Family vacation (if given at least 1 month notice to band staff)

- 2. Examples of unexcused absences from the band events and/or practices may include *(but not limited to)*:
 - a. Conflict with work/employer
 - b. Other extra-curricular activities/sports that may overlap
 - c. Personal appoints (hair, nail, etc)
 - d. Oversleeping
 - e. Social activities
 - f. Negligence in obtaining the practice/perform schedule or asking a staff member/captain.
 - g. Outside/Non-Wilmington performance activities
 - h. Unplanned family events not approved by the band staff in advance

II.IV W.A.S.D. SCHOOL BOARD RULES

- Following games, parades and other activities, band members must return to the school on the band buses unless they are riding home with their parents. For safety reasons, we ask that parents meet the band director/chaperone at the bus to fill out the required form to take your child. Band members will not be permitted to leave with anyone other than a parent.
- In order to ensure the safety of each individual, and to be certain that each student complies with school policies regarding drugs and alcohol, student luggage and instrument cases will be searched prior to loading the buses on trips and band camp.
- <u>Copies of and/or proof of health insurance coverage</u> must be on file with the school district and with the band and must accompany the band on all trips and at band camp.
- An <u>Extracurricular Activities Permission Form</u> must be completed and on file with the school district and the band.
- A <u>Permission to Attend Band Camp Form</u> must be completed and signed by the parent/guardian and on file with the school district and with the band. This permission form must accompany the band to camp.
- A <u>Permission to Attend Band Trip Form</u> must be completed and signed by the parent/guardian and be on file with the school district and the band. This form must accompany the band on the band trip(s).
- A <u>Medical Form</u> must be completed and signed by the parent(s)/guardian(s) and be on file with the school district and band. This form must accompany the band on all trips, games, parades, events, etc.
- <u>Prescription Medication</u> must be in an original container, in the child's name, with the correct dosage instructions and must not be out of date.

II.V W.A.H.S. SEASON RULES

- All music should be memorized before attending band camp or to the best of the student's abilities. Any band member who does not have his/her music memorized must attend additional music rehearsals during the week of band camp.
- No hiking boots, work boots, cowboy boots, crocs, or flip-flops are allowed during marching rehearsal. Tennis shoes only. Failure to adhere will result in a demerit.
- Vandalism of any kind will not be tolerated and students/parents will incur any relevant costs to repair or replace damage items. Disciplinary actions within the band and school district will also be taken.
- Attendance to all meals is required while at band camp.
- Each band member must read and sign the Code of Conduct Form.
- Each band member must read and sign the Uniform Care Form.
- Each band member must read and sign the Rules and Regulations List Form.
- Each band member must read and sign the Refund Policy Form.
- Each band member is to abide by rules and guidelines outlined in this document and in the 2020 Return to Instruction Wilmington Band Action Plan along with the Wilmington Area School District rules and policies regarding student conduct.
 - Failure to adhere to all rules, guidelines, and policies set forth by the band staff and district may result in dismissal from the band organization or disciplinary actions.
- Band members must adhere to Wilmington Area School District's dress code while at band camp. Inappropriate attire will be determined by the chaperones.
- Students must remain on campus during each day of camp and during all season practices/events until dismissed by the director and band staff. Students will not be permitted to leave during breaks or meal times.
- Any infraction of any of the rules may result in any of the following: head chaperone(s) and/or Mr. Nickel calling the parents, being sent home from band camp, the Principal and/or Administration being notified, expulsion from the band.
- Band members are required to ride to and from all away games on the buses provided by the school. A written excuse, signed by a parent/guardian, must be given to the chaperone to enable a member to ride home from away games and events with a parent/guardian. Band members will not be dismissed from the stands. Parents must meet band member at the bus at the end of the game or event.
- Any band member wanting to quit the band at any time during this season must meet with Mr. Nickel. A parent of the band member must be in attendance at the meeting. This meeting cannot take place at an event. If the band member chooses to quit after this meeting, he or she may not be eligible to participate the following season as determined by the band staff, administration, and director.
- In order to participate in the Wilmington Area Greyhound Marching Band and Concert Band, ALL band members must be registered through the guidance department and take band as an academic class throughout the entire academic school year.
- Student participation in both marching band AND concert band is required.

• Cell phones and other electronic devices should be off and away during ALL rehearsals and performances. Failure to comply with this policy may result in disciplinary actions, parent contact, and temporary confiscation of the device by a member of the band staff.

II.VI UNIFORM CARE TIPS

BAND UNIFORMS:

- Students are responsible for purchasing and maintaining their own white band shoes. These will be purchased at the end of the school year prior to camp.
- Please wear a WAHS Band T-shirt and shorts under the uniform in warmer weather, and sweats and/or insulated underwear in cold weather.
- Please do not do anything that will stain the uniform... if you do and uniform gets dirty, you are responsible for paying for the uniform to be dry-cleaned before the next performance.
- Please hang the uniform neatly and correctly on a hanger before turning it in to the uniform room, as this eliminates wrinkles.
- Hat Plumes are <u>NOT</u> to be kept in the student's hatbox. They must be turned in to the parent uniform committee at the end of each performance.
- The White hats must be wiped down after every performance before being put away. This is the STUDENT'S responsibility, which will help to prevent any stains.
- NO temporary hair coloring spray or dye of any type is allowed to be applied before a performance in which the band hats are worn.

BAND FRONT UNIFORMS:

- DO NOT ALLOW PERFUME, HAIRSPRAY, OR DEODORANT TO COME IN CONTACT WITH SEQUINS.
- If garment becomes wet, air dry DO NOT USE HEAT.
- Do not store in an airtight bag.
- The need for any repairs should be brought to the attention of the Band front instructor or Parent in charge of uniforms.
- Please do not do anything that will stain the uniform... if you do and uniform gets dirty, you are responsible for the uniform being HAND WASHED (no dry cleaning) before the next performance.
- HAND WASH ONLY use a very gentle baby detergent with cold/mild water.
 - Turn inside-out and gently hand wash in a large tub or sink.
 - Lay flat on towels to AIR dry to prevent shrinkage.
- Please hang the uniform neatly and correctly on a hanger before turning it in to the uniform room, as this eliminates wrinkles.
- Sequins are not to be taken or kept at student's homes!

SECTION III.I BAND CAMP INFORMATION

This is the only packet of information that you will receive concerning band camp, so please read it carefully. All attached forms (permission, medical, extracurricular, and questionnaire) must be completed and returned immediately.

<u>DATES</u>: Band camp will run from Monday, July 26 thru Friday, July 30. Band Camp will be held with all members attending each daily practice at Wilmington Area High School.

<u>LOCATION</u>: This year's camp will be held at the Wilmington school district campus instead of Wesley Woods as a precautionary measure while covid cases decline and vaccinations becomes available. Students will report to the check-in station at the high school band room each day.

<u>TIMES</u>: Camp will run each day from 8:00am - 10:00pm and students will report to the high school band room main entrance for check-in and attendance to be taken. Students will not be permitted to leave the campus at anytime during the week of camp until they are formally dismissed or given approval by the director to leave.

<u>ATTENDANCE</u>: All students are required to attend and participate in band camp. Please refer to section II.III regarding the attendance policy and examples. Illness and death in the family will be the only excused absence during the week of camp and Mr. Nickel or a member of the band staff should be notified as soon as possible regarding the reason for absence. If a student fails to attend for any unexcused reason or is tardy to rehearsal, they may incur demerits, disciplinary actions, or possible suspension or expulsion from the organization.

III.II BAND CAMP GUIDELINES & SCHEDULE

EQUIPMENT NEEDED:

- 1. Instrument and all your music each day
- 2. A protective mask or face covering (if required by the district)
- 3. Personal sunscreen, hat, and other protective gear from the elements
- 4. Hand Sanitizer
- 5. A packed lunch each day
- 6. A personal water bottle is recommended but water will be provided each day to the students
- 7. All band front equipment
- 8. White or light-colored cotton t-shirts or tops (clothing that reflects the sun) are recommended for comfort. For the field marching practices, you should wear tennis shoes or sneakers (more than one pair is recommended since the field is always wet in the morning). All clothes must be loose fitting and in accordance with school dress code. *Students wearing clothing deemed inappropriate will be asked to change*

MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION:

- > The band staff will provide a nurse and a first aid station.
 - All medications will be checked in with the nurse on duty for the day and administered as needed by the nurse.
 - All prescription medications will need to be accompanied with a parent signed medication authorization form detailed administration amounts, times, and restrictions.
- It has been well established that all music must be memorized by band camp. If you attend summer rehearsals and work on your own, this task is attainable. Those who do not have their music memorized by camp will lose free time until all music is memorized.
- Students will provide their own water and bagged meals for lunch. All meals will be eaten while students are socially distanced.
- Dinner will be provided to the students in individually package portions and prepared by a restaurant or food vendor that adheres to the CDC, state, and local guidelines regarding food safety.
- Due to safety concerns, students will not be permitted to leave the Wilmington campus or its facilities during breaks, meals, or at anytime until dismissed by the director or a staff member at the conclusion of the day's camp activities or for emergency reasons.
- For the safety of the students, all rehearsals will be "closed" in which unauthorized parents, spectators, and visitors will not be permitted to enter the facility, observe rehearsals, or interact with students.
- Students will need to provide the district and camp staff with the annual emergency medical forms, parent contact information, and proof of medical insurance in the event of an emergency.

SECTION V CHAPERONE INFORMATION

Guidelines for Chaperones

A chaperone committee chairperson is selected by the executive committee of the band boosters. This committee and the head chaperones will be responsible for choosing the chaperones for the various band events. The committee will use the following guidelines in choosing chaperones for band camp and throughout the season. These guidelines were established by a committee and approved by the executive committee several years ago.

REQUIREMENTS TO CHAPERONE (BAND CAMP & THE SCHOOL YEAR):

- 1) Pennsylvania State Police (Act 34 clearance)
- 2) Child Abuse clearance,
- 3) Volunteer form completed and on file with the District *before* he or she can be considered. This is simplified by stopping at the superintendent's office to pick up a packet. Results take a month or longer.
- 4) Prospective chaperones also must have a TB test and proof of results.
- 5) FBI fingerprinted at the IU in Grove City, PA
- 6) Act 168 Form
- 7) ALL FORMS AND INSTRUCTIONS CAN BE FOUND AT THE WILMINGTON AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPERINTENT'S OFFICE

- ✓ Mix of gender (we will need an appropriate ratio of males and females given the makeup of the band)
- ✓ The dates for which the prospective chaperones are available (all of band camp or if available for only part, what days/nights need coverage)
- ✓ Event/Performance types and need for chaperones

SECTION V.I ADDITIONAL CHAPERONE INFORMATION

Responsibilities of the chaperones are as follows:

- 1. Assist with the loading/unloading of the equipment van.
- 2. Assist in distribution and collection of uniforms and raincoats
- 3. Carry, load, and unload band front props and equipment.
- 4. Count the numbers of students on the bus before leaving the school and before leaving the event site.
- 5. Keep order on the bus.
- 6. Carry equipment to and from the football field.
- 7. Escort band members to the restrooms.
- 8. Escort band members to the buses or school for forgotten equipment.
- 9. Pour and distribute beverages.
- 10. Help with ill students.
- 11. Assist with the cleaning up of the bleachers and picking up of articles left behind.
- 12. If necessary, pick up litter on the buses and any articles left behind.
- 13. Assist the band director and the head chaperones as needed.
- 14. Help put away band uniforms.

WASD & WABB Expectations for Chaperones:

- 1. Be professional at all times when dealing with students (i.e. no vulgarity, inappropriate behaviors etc.)
- No consumption of alcohol or other drugs/substances while chaperoning or at an event/camp/spring trip


